
I also thank the media who have featured us in their esteemed publications which encouraged us further to give our best in every step of our journey.

Boarding an early morning train from Howrah, we set out on a musical journey to discover the roots of the Bengal culture.

After the break of dusk, the students of Tabla.Inc presented the pieces celebrating the community and nature. Angira Chakraborty joined us in performing a dance depiction on the Shiv Tandav stotram. The day ended with a vibrant folk dance performance, where everyone joined in and danced to the ethnic beats. The next morning, the entire fraternity of students gathered around as Guruji himself engaged in a parhanth session. The participants engaged in a pottery and textile designing workshop, where they got a chance to create their own art through these mediums. Following that, two powerful performances of Dhak and Dhol made the audience stand on their feet and groove along to the intricate rhythms of these traditional instruments. Mrs. Ramanjit Kaur, the founder of The Creative Arts, performed a site specific improvisational piece while everyone watched in awe.




Pubarun Basu is now an International Delegate by Google in Rare Leadership Academy






Arup Kumar Bag:

The evening began with an introduction of the faculty members of the Academy by the maestro himself. A beautiful 'Chaiti' was rendered by Vidushi Piu Mukherjee which mesmerized the audience. Soumyadeep Das, one of the students of Pdt Tanmoy Bose, continued to enthrall with his Tabla solo where he played some beautiful traditional compositions based on Teen-taal. In turn, Ms. Swastika Mukherjee, one of the leading singers of Western vocals, spell bounded the audience with her rendition. The concluding session was a wonderful performance by Mr. Bodhisattwa Ghosh on Spanish guitar where he played his own compositions. The event gave the audience exposure to 'Fusion' which is not just an amalgamation but a creation.

The Jalsa Series

Jalsa is a performance series conceptualized by Pandit Tanmoy Bose, presented by his disciples and other guest artistes under the banner of Tabla.inc. This has been conceptualized with the intention to promote "baithaki" arena of music where the performers and audience get 'up & close' scope of interactions. The homely air around the performances promotes two important things- it evokes interest amongst the audience about classical music and stimulates the budding artists to be comfortable with their audience. It also trains them with correct etiquettes and decorums of being an artist from a young age.

Jalsa at Deshaj

The first Jalsa was presented at a beautifully decorated café, Deshaj, located at Old Ballygunge on 4th November 2022. The first half was a section called TaalTarang in which disciples of Pandit Tanmoy Bose played tabla lahara based on Teentaal. The presentation, especially the drut section was appreciated highly by the audience. In the second half, singer Piu Mukherjee put forward her mesmerizing vocals accompanied by Shri Pradip Palit on harmonium and Shri Soumyadeep Das on Tabla. She presented Vilambit bandish, Tappa, Khayal, Dadra and other songs based on ragas like Jog, Mishra Kafi, Behag etc. But one song that needs special mention was Chala Re Pardesia album KashiKatha. which conceptualised by Pandit Tanmoy Bose himself. The audience was thrilled to witness the performance in presence of both the artists.











Jalsa at Anandalok

The second Jalsa baithak was hosted at Anandalok near Ballygunge Phari on 23rd December 2022. The stage was set ablaze by eight little stars of Pandit Tanmoy Bose. They presented the TaalTarang section, which a teentaal tabla lahara presentation that included a few kaida, rela, tukra and chakradars. The little artists held the audience in awe of their finesse and maturity of performance.

This was then followed by a one of a kind performance by Smt.Chandra Chakraborty, supported by Shri Soumyadeep Das on Tabla and Shri Dwaipayan Roy on Harmonium. Smt.Chakraborty put forth a unique enactment based on the life of the legendary Indubala Devi. The audience stood witness to an era of history brought back to life, adorned with some beautiful musical jewels. She enacted the difficult life scenarios of Indubala Devi through songs and dialogues, assisted by Shri Shubhadeep Chakraborty in her enactment. The presentation recreated her interactions with famous personalities of the bygone era and with few not-so-famous personalities that affected the flow of life of the great musical virtuoso. It was a fresh experience for most of the people present in the audience and deserved all the applause it got at the culmination of the event.

The third session of Jalsa was hosted at Burdwan Townhall on 27th December 2022. In this event, the first section was a tabla lahara presented by six disciples of Pandit Tanmoy Bose, which was called the TaalTarang section. It was a mixed bag of kaida, rela, tukra and chakradars, all based on Teentaal.

In the next section, Smt.Manali Bose presented her immaculate singing and was accompanied by Shri Emon Sarkar on Tabla and Shri Saptak on harmonium. She presented a khayal based on raag Behag, a thumri on raag Pilu and the immortal song, Koyelia gaan thama, composed by Pandit Jnan Prakash Ghosh.

It was a bright beautiful day for the audience at Burdwan who were pleasantly surprised to see the young blood coming up and considering Indian Classical Music as a career choice and being so dedicated about it. This is exactly what Pandit Tanmoy Bose dreams of and such response is exactly what is propelling Tabla.Inc towards its dream reality of spreading classical music to every household and making it the mainstream music of indian populace.











Jalsaghar
